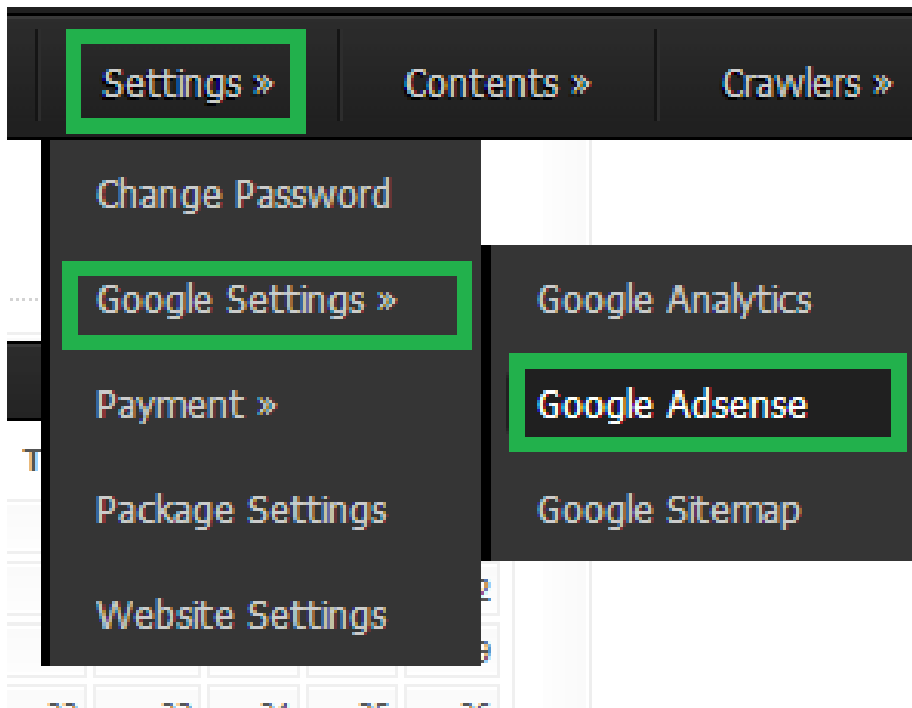

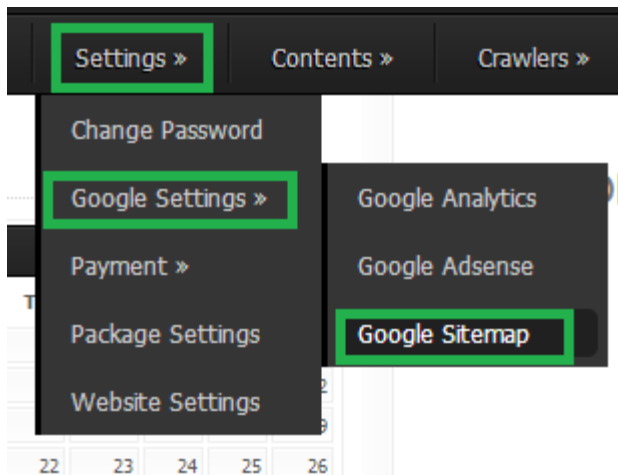
Introduction:

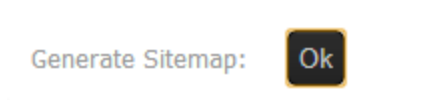

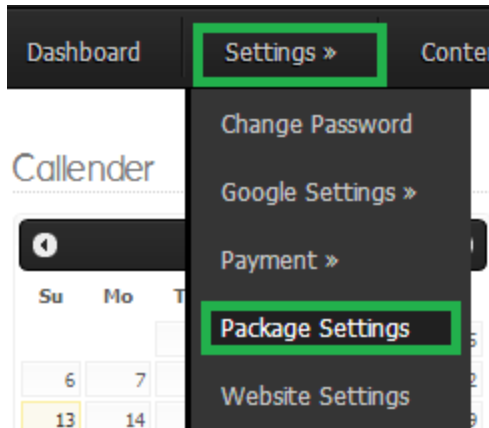

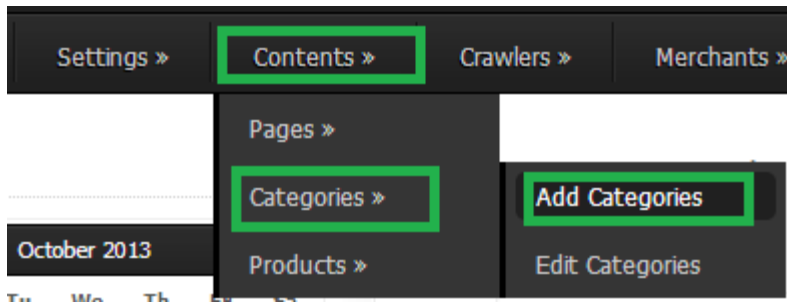

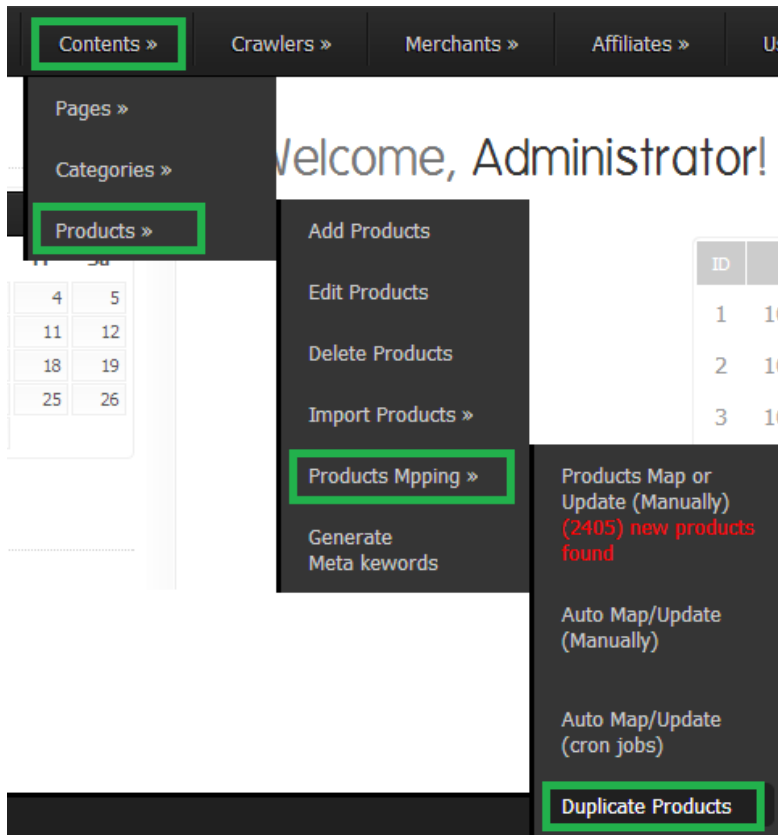

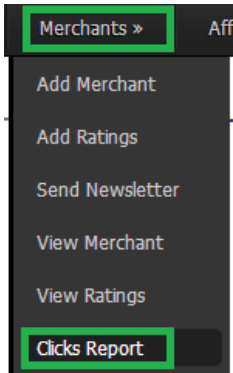
